II. Project Description

The project is being bid as a base bid and two alternate bids. If accepted, alternate No. 1 will be included in the basis of award. Alternate No. 2 will not. The project consists of providing all labor, materials, equipment and local building department permitting for the construction of the South Terminal Expansion and In-Line Baggage System. The project includes building demolition, civil construction, building construction, drainage, etc. Coordination with TSA, FAA, Charlotte County Building Department and FPL has been completed. No issues have been noted.

• A presentation of the project requirements were made by specific discipline designer. Various drawings were presented on the video screens as the discussion pursued.

XII. Site Visit and Questions

A site visit was conducted at the conclusion of the meeting. Questions and responses withing the meeting were as follows:

- Are bidders responsible for porters on the area behind ticketing counter work?
 Response: Yes
- 2. The outside air intake louvers meet the requirements from generator and aircraft distances?

Response: We meet minimum required distance from generator and OA louvers are away from aircraft, landside.

3. What are the requirements on badging on subcontractors: Response: Training is offered 3 days a week and last about 1 hour.

4. We have a concern meeting the schedule due to equipment procurement periods. How will this be addressed?

Response: Phase 1 Mobilization time can be extended. The airport wants to minimize the physical on-site construction period.

5. Are the chiller lines dedicated?

Response: The added third chiller will use the lines installed in the original construction project.

6. Has the Authority discussed the new service with FPL?

Response: Yes. FPL is currently engineering their part of the new service and will order the new transformer.

7. Special Provision #3 seems to indicate the contractor is to work a 50-hour week. Is this a requirement?

Response: No. These are standard work hours for airport staff. Forecasted construction activity will be discussed at weekly meetings.

8. What is the project budget?

Response: The construction estimate is around \$20 million.

9. Who is responsible for temporary fencing?

Response: The contractor is responsible. Information is provided on the drawings.
